

Thought for the Month:

Why did the Creator of the Universe come to earth as the vulnerable baby Jesus?

This side of the grave we cannot begin to fully comprehend the workings of the creator of the universe, but we need to try and he has given us many clues.

He had observed the mess which humans, the finest fruits of creation and evolution, had made with hatred, cruelty, and violence over several thousand years of prehistory. But the Old Testament relates how in the Middle East, through the prophets of Israel, he tried to reveal what he had hoped for. They partially understood the beauty and goodness of his creation, as is revealed in some of the Psalms.

The world was in those times ruled by tribal nationalism (still popular), and much of the suffering in the world not associated with hunger, drought and disease was caused by that. Some of the prophets realised that divine assistance was required, and they hoped and believed that God would provide a great leader to take charge.

Christians believe that God chose instead to visit the earth personally and save mankind from itself by massive injection of his spiritual power, love and grace.

As C S Lewis wrote in his magnificent book 'Mere Christianity':

Why is God landing in this enemy-occupied world in disguise and starting a sort of secret society to undermine the devil? Why is he not landing in force, invading it? Is it that He is not strong enough? Well, Christians think He is going to land in force; we do not know when. But we can guess why he is delaying. He wants to give us the chance of joining His side freely. But I wonder whether people who ask God to interfere openly and directly in our world quite realise what it will be like when He does.

When that happens it is the end of the world. When the author walks onto the stage the play is over. God is going to invade all right: but what is the good of saying you are on His side then, when you see the whole natural universe melting away like a dream and something else - something it never entered your head to conceive - comes crashing in; something so beautiful to some of us and so terrible to others that none of us will have any choice left? For this time it will be God without disguise; something so overwhelming that it will strike either irresistible love or irresistible horror into every creature.

It will be too late to choose your side. That will not be the time for choosing: it will be the time when we discover which side we really have chosen, whether we realised it before or not, Now, today, this moment, is our chance to choose the right side. God is holding back to give us that chance. It will not last for ever. We must take it or leave it.
