VICAR'S LETTER

May saw the end of the major festivals of the Christian Church with Pentecost and the Ascension. The word 'Pentecost' has Greek origins and means 'fiftieth' hence Pentecost is a festival 50 days after Easter. It is the time when the Christian Church celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Christian Church. The bible tells us that over 3000 people were baptised on that day nearly 2000 years ago. 

SAVE THE DATE - KINGSCOTE CHRISTMAS CRACKER

We are hoping to hold Kingscote's Christmas Cracker event on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th October 2021, in the garden of Hunters' Hall, by kind permission of Greene King.

This cracker of an event will feature artisan stallholders, food and drink, activities for children and adults plus music and entertainment throughout the two days. More details will be published in The Forerunner and on a dedicated Kingscote online website page.

The event is being organised by residents of our parish, including Bagpath and Newington and coordinated by <u>Soffi Bond</u> who wishes to thank people who have already put their names forward to volunteer for this important event. It's shaping up to be great fun and will also raise valuable funds for our community including the proposed safety rail in the Church gallery, Tetbury Hospital and Macmillan (the latter being Greene King's designated charity)

Volunteers - More volunteers will be welcomed to help and a variety of practical roles are available either in advance or on the day- from set up, traffic management, meet and greet 'on the door' helping on activity and community stands etc. Or maybe you have an idea for an activity or stand which you can put forward or you could help with publicity. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Ashcroft Road, Bagpath- land at grid reference 380262 195353 - New road to enable removal of felled trees. Application validated 5.05.21. No consultation expiry date provided.

8 Bagpath - Demolition of existing garage and replacement with two storey side extension. rear single storey extension and replacement of front elevation to provide front porch. Application validated 8.05.2021. Consultation expiry date- 1.06.2021

Whiteladies, Kingscote - Change of use of existing outbuilding to ancillary annexe accommodation. Application validated 19.02.2021. Consultation expiry date -8.06.2021

Jasmine Cottage, 37 Kingscote- Demolition of detached garage and construction of 2 storey extension. Application validated 24.03.2021. Consultation expiry date 10.06.2021.

Note - Only applications classed by Cotswold District Council as 'current' and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Foreunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be 21 days after validation of the application by Cotswold District Council although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

Note- Only applications classed by Cotswold District Council as 'current' and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Foreunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be 21 days after validation of the application by Cotswold District Council although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from Cotswold District Council.



PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

- 1. The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Tuesday 29 June at 7.30pm at Home Farm. Graham Nichols is kindly making a barn available for the meeting, and all parishioners are invited to attend. If you have issues which you would like to discuss, these may be raised on the night, but it would help with planning the agenda if you could advise Sebastian Cooper beforehand.
- 2. Fibre Broadband

- a. Gigaclear contractors have completed installation of fibre broadband through the central part of Kingscote village and these cables are now live. Contractors are expected to return in July or August to continue the installation in the rest of the parish, particularly Bagpath. We have not yet received a schedule for completing the work.
- b. Openreach are also planning to install fibre broadband in parts of Kingscote. Their contractors (Citiutilities) have permission to close the road between the phone box and the church from 14-25 June to install a new duct. Subsequently they have permission to close the road from the phone box to Hunter's Hall between 21 June and 12 July. This second phase could be disruptive since the trench will be in the carriageway. There will be signs in place and a contact number available before the work starts.

- 3. Bagpath Common Ash Dieback. GCC Highways have provisionally scheduled work on the trees affected by ash dieback for November 2021. but this might have to be postponed to 2022 depending on other priorities. About 60 trees are expected to be felled because they endanger the roads. The work is expected to take about five days with road closures between 0930 and 1530 each day.
- 4. Parish Clerk vacancy. The Parish Council is advertising for a parish clerk to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of our previous clerk, Fiona Thornton. During the interim period, the Chair of the Council, Sebastian Cooper, is acting as clerk and Responsible Financial officer.
