VICAR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

This month sees the coming of the season of lent with Ash Wednesday when traditionally, the foreheads of Christians are marked with ash. Ashes are an ancient sign of penitence which became the custom from the middle ages as a way of marking the beginning of Lent.

The day before is one of my most favourite days, Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day. No going on a diet that day for me! Shrove Tuesday was traditionally the time to use up food that couldn't be eaten during Lent. This included eggs, fat and milk, which were made into pancakes and eaten on that day. This was also the last chance for a spot of indulgence before 40 days of fasting. Fasting is a Christian discipline marking the 40 days of lent, when instead of a meal. Christians reflect on the time Jesus was being tempted in the wilderness and ultimately the journey to his death on the cross. Today Christians may not fast, but may give up one particular thing for lent, often something like chocolate, or another treat. People today often choose to take something up rather than give something up, perhaps take on a good deed, helping a neighbour, visiting someone who is lonely or taking on a task to help the community in some way. Following our Lenten season, we will arrive at Easter and celebrate Jesus' resurrection

Later on this month, on Sunday 27th March, we will celebrate Mothering Sunday and say thanks to our mothers or mothering person. All are welcome to come and join in the service at St John the Baptist at 9.30am where posies of flowers will be handed out. Please come along if you can.

I wish you all a good Lenten season

Our Archbishops are inviting us to pray for Ukraine, Russia and for peace - to join the nation to make Sunday 27th February a day of prayer for peace; to pray with the Diocese in Europe on Tuesday 1st March at 6pm, and to join in Pope Francis's call to make Wednesday 2nd March a day of prayer and fasting for peace. Phone bookings are possible for those only without internet access- phone 01452 596 626 Note - Only applications classed by CDC as 'current' and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications it is recommended that you <u>check the CDC website regularly and/or</u> <u>register to receive email alerts direct from</u> <u>CDC</u>.

Public meeting to discuss climate change and biodiversity activities in Kingscote Parish Monday 7 March 2022 at 7.30pm in Kingscote Village Hall

A public meeting is arranged for Monday 7 March at Kingscote village hall to discuss what actions we might wish to take, either as individuals or as a community, to help reduce the adverse effects of climate change and biodiversity loss. Please come along if you can and share your ideas.

We all want to avoid unnecessary damage to the environment, but it is not always easy to know what we should do for the best. Sometimes we get conflicting advice, and reliable objective guidance can be difficult to find.

Some neighbouring towns have established Climate Action Networks to provide a focus for discussion, dissemination of useful advice and coordination of activities. Kingscote Parish might wish to do something similar, on a smaller scale, or alternatively link with a local group. The meeting on 7 March will be to establish the level of interest in climate actions, to canvas opinions on what is desirable and to decide what we might do next. The objectives are:

1. To encourage individual and community activities aimed at sustainability

2. To provide a forum for sharing ideas and pooling knowledge

3. To make it easier for residents to get reliable, objective advice

1. Introduction

 Brief presentation by Sam Munton who is Chair of Wotton Area Climate Change Network. She will outline what this group does and answer questions.

 General discussion of what topics are of interest to residents and how to move forward.
Attitudes to the current consultation on climate actions by Cotswold District Council

Background notes:

<u>Cotswold District Council</u> adopted an Ecological Emergency Plan in July 2002 and a Climate Emergency Strategy in September 2020.

The Council is currently consulting on an <u>update to its Local Plan</u> to include climate and biodiversity actions. The consultation closes on 20 March 2022.
