1. Recent meetings

The AGM of the parish council was held on Tuesday 14 May 2024 and was preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting the AGM of the village hall committee. Tony Wooldridge was re-elected as chair with Beth Calland as vice-chair. Brian McTear has resigned as chair of the village hall committee after 8 years in the role and 16 years on the committee. The parish council thanked Brian for the tremendous commitment he has made throughout this time and congratulated the whole committee for maintaining the village hall in a good condition and organising

Ash dieback work on Scrubbetts Lane. We have been pressing the Ash Dieback team to complete the work started during the week of 12-16 June 2023.

Unfortunately, they have declined to commit to a date for their return because of work on higher priority roads. The team has pointed out that not all residents complied with their request to avoid non-essential traffic movements during the closure period, and this seriously impacted the amount of felling achieved. They also said that some residents raised objections to the work last year.

Potholes on Scrubbetts Lane. We are campaigning to get repairs done on the many potholes on this road near Bagpath.

3. Village Hall boundary wall

We are very grateful to the Cotswold Voluntary Wardens who have completed rebuilding the boundary wall of the village hall. Thanks to a donation from Mrs Ingleby-Oddy for the 'cocks and hens' topping, there has been no cost to the parish council.


