PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At time of drafting this newsletter there were no planning applications within the parish listed on the CDC website page and having a consultation expiry date in October 2024.

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC.

Parish Council Update

1. GCC Highways matters.

After persistent requests from the parish council, the tarmac on the majority of Scrubbetts Lane has been patched. We are now focusing on getting the surface improved at several locations on Hazlecote Lane. In preparation for winter, we have shared our winter plan with Highways, updated the spreadsheet of salt bins and piles and requested a few new bins where necessary. The drains in Kingscote village were cleared by contractors, Sapphire, in mid-September.

Highways have confirmed that re-erecting the signpost where Barnhill Road joins the A4135 is on their work plan.

Thanks to our voluntary footpath warden, the route of the footpath near Bagpath Church is now more clearly signed.

2. Grant money for recarpeting at the village hall.

Thanks to our parish clerk we have received £1200 from the Build Back Better Fund for recarpeting the lobby and stairs at the village hall.

3. Household emergency plans.

Households who already have an emergency plan are encouraged to check that the details are still correct, and households who don't yet have one are encouraged to download the <u>template</u> from the website:


