#### Vicar's letter

#### Dear Friends

In the Church's calendar, this month opens with the feast of the Presentation of Christ in the temple, or Candlemas. Candlemas marks the moment when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the temple. It is the beautiful moment in the Gospel of Luke that reminds us of how the prophets Simeon and Anna, recognized Jesus as the Messiah, the light to the nations and the one who would bring peace to the world.

Peace is something we all long for. In the bible, in Luke's gospel we read that when Simeon saw the baby Jesus he said: "My eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel." Jesus came as the Prince of Peace, offering hope and reconciliation to a broken world.

As we look around us today, we see a world that desperately needs peace, where people cry out to live in peace. Division, conflict runs deep in communities and wars rage in many countries. Our hearts can feel overwhelmed as we find it so hard to understand.

We are reminded at Candlemas, that Jesus came as a light to the world. This light shines when people come together to reflect his love and peace in the world. This light is reflected in those who show love and compassion to others such as those who provide aid, shelter and hope to those affected by war and through leaders who work towards ceasefires and peaceful resolutions.

At the time of writing this letter, there are glimpses of light as hundreds of Prisoners have been released in Ukraine and Russia, and there is news of a ceasefire-hostage release agreement declared in Gaza. There is still a long way to go, but these are glimmers of light shining in the darkness.

Jesus teaches us that peace is not achieved by conflict, but by loving one another. His peace is absence of conflict and not just its absence, but can be seen by following his teachings of love, tolerance and forgiveness. Candles are lit at Candlemas, the symbol of light in a dark world, a reminder of that love and peace of Jesus.

In my February letter last year, I wrote about the beauty of snowdrops and how they symbolise a new beginning. We live in hope of new beginnings, of peace in the world, and hope that for many who have suffered so long, will know a new and peaceful beginning.

The mobile post office will be at Kingscote Village Hall from 9am to 10am every Monday and Thursday except bank holidays.

#### **Planning applications**

At time of drafting this newsletter the following planning applications within the parish were listed on the CDC website page and had a consultation expiry date in February 2025.

- 4 Lower Hazlecote Cottages, Kingscote, GL8 8XX- erection of single and two storey side extension to dwelling. Consultation expiry date of 13.02.25.
- Lower Hazelcote Farm, Kingscote, GL8 8XX Installation of dormer window and refurbishment of existing dormer window. Consultation expiry date of 5.02.2025.

**Note**- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

#### Parish council update

1. Parish Council precept for 2025-26.

The Council met on 14<sup>th</sup> January and decided to set the precept for 2025/26 at £5470. This is an increase of £410 on the current year's precept of £5060. The budget for next year was agreed as £5670 which might require £200 to be taken from reserves, but we may be able to avoid that by careful budgeting.

#### 2. GCC Highways.

The GCC Highways Manager has inspected the road in Hazlecote Valley and requested further repairs. We are also expecting a repair in Kingscote opposite the Walled Garden.

#### 3. Winter preparations.

When snow was forecast on 4 January, councillors alerted the snow plough operator and prepared the new salt spreader. Fortunately, the snow on the roads soon melted and no action was needed. On 9 January the areas where pedestrians walk in Kingscote were very icy and the salt spreader proved effective in reducing the risk of accidents.

#### 3. Next meeting.

The next meeting of the parish council will be on Tuesday 11 March at 7.30pm in Kingscote village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
