VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends



Easter day will be celebrated on Sunday 20th April. The church will once again have told the story of the journey through Holy week. Holy week begins on Palm Sunday, with the commemoration of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We come then to Maundy Thursday when we remember Jesus sharing the last supper with his disciples, before Good Friday and the Passion of Jesus, when remember his death on the cross.

During Lent there are no flowers in our churches, but when Easter Day arrives, so does the colour. Flowers often have meanings, they represent qualities or events. Lilies are often chosen to display at Easter as they represent a sign of purity and goodness reminding us that Jesus was pure and perfect when he died on the cross.

The Passion Flower holds symbolic meaning in Christianity. The parts of the flower telling the story of Jesus' passion and crucifixion. This goes back to Spanish Christian Missionaries who explained each part of the flower with the story of Jesus' Passion.


In the purple flower, which is also the church colour for the season of Lent, the circle of petals (filaments), represent the crown of thorns that Jesus wore. The flower has ten petals, which represent the ten disciples who did not betray or deny Jesus - so minus Judas, who betrayed Jesus and Peter who denied him. The three stigma represent the three nails that held Jesus to the cross and the five anthers, the five wounds of Jesus (hands, feet and side.)

The flower helps us retell the story of Holy Week, of Jesus' journey to the cross and death. But without these events, there would be no Easter. Easter Day we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, his rising from the dead. Here the lilies come in, as they are a sign of new life and resurrection.

Erection of replacement self-build dwelling Upper Hazelcote Cottage, Hazlecote Farm Lane, Kingscote, Tetbury, Gloucestershire GL8 8XX Ref. No: 25/00333/FUL | Validated: Tue 18 Feb 2025 | Status: Awaiting decision

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC. <u>https://publicaccess.cotswold.gov.uk/onlineapplications/</u>

Parish Council Update

1.Support from District and County Councilors

Although we have continued to have excellent support from our District Councilor, Tony Slater, our County Councilor has been unable to attend our meetings for some time. We are pleased that Stephan Fifield, Deputy Leader of Gloucestershire County Council, has now agreed to act as our County Councilor. He attended our recent meeting, and we believe his support will be very helpful.

2. GCC Highways

We are pleased to note that the sign at the top of Barnhill Lane has been repaired, about a year after it was first reported. Similarly, after persistent chasing, the water utility has replaced the missing cover on the valve pit at the top of Windmill Lane. We have reported some of the recent road repairs in the Hazlecote Valley and Kingscote village as unsatisfactory and GCC Highways has promised remedial action.

3. General Power of Competence

Since our parish clerk, Simon Hale, has recently successfully completed his CiLCA qualification and is now fully qualified, and all five councilor positions are elected, we are now eligible to use the General Power of Competence. This gives us more freedom to act in the interests of the community.

4.Village Hall Insurance

We have agreed that the buildings and contents insurance for the village hall should be combined into a single policy held by the village hall committee, and that the Parish Council will continue to pay for the buildings insurance via a grant to the committee.

5.Next meeting.

The next meeting of the parish council will be the AGM on Tuesday 13 May in Kingscote village hall. This will be preceded by the AGM of the village hall management committee at 7.00 pm and the annual parish meeting at 7.30 pm. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
